



### UVAS, US officials discuss food safety issues



The University of Veterinary and Animal Sciences Lahore and officials from the United States discussed food safety issues at a meeting at the City Campus. Pro Vice-Chancellor Prof Dr Masood Rabbani and Mr Casey E Bean, Agricultural Counselor, US Embassy Islamabad, co-chaired the meeting. Others in attendance were Emeritus Prof Dr Nasim Ahmad, UVAS food safety experts from different departments and other members of the US delegation Dr Martin Sieber, President/CEO, US Livestock Genetics Export, Inc. USA, and Mr Asmat Raza, Senior Agricultural Specialist, US Embassy.

The meeting discussed various aspects of food safety problems/issues, their possible solutions, food safety standards and how to ensure safe food availability to the consumers. Food safety management under the umbrella of one health approach related to livestock sector was also discussed in the meeting.

The UVAS food safety experts spoke about the food safety systems which can be adopted for improving and ensuring that livestock food products are safe and healthy for eating. They said that UVAS is providing different testing facilities for meat and other feed analysis, using latest

The delegation members also planted saplings in front of Prof Akram Complex. Later they visited the Dairy Training and Research Center at B-Block where they took keen interest in Holstein Friesian cows imported from the US for the training of students and professionals.

Mr Casey E Bean appreciated the stateof-the-art labs, clinics, cattle farms and other facilities. He said that Pakistan is protein-providing nation and emphasized on the use of latest technology for enhancing agricultural yield and genetics improvement for increase in livestock productivity.

Mr Casey Bean also assured the UVAS of help in the process of getting accreditation from the Association of American Veterinary Medical Colleges.

# Vice-Chancellor Prof Pasha visits Italy, discusses scientific cooperation with Italian experts for safe milk production

University of Veterinary and Animal Sciences Lahore Vice-Chancellor Prof Dr Talat Naseer Pasha paid a weeklong visit to Italy as part of a study tour of a Pakistani business delegation about livestock and dairy sector to seek international scientific and technological cooperation for production of antibioticfree safe milk in the country.

The study tour was arranged by the United Nations Industrial Development Organization (UNIDO) and OZOLEA Rete Agricola, Italy. The tour comprised of business meetings, a seminar, visits to companies and farms and other allied networking initiatives in cities of Milan, Brescia, Cremona, Turin, Cuneo and Rome.

The Vice-Chancellor and other tour participants exchanged views and experiences on livestock and dairy industry aimed at development of skills and know-how in Pakistan's milk processing. They discussed solutions on how to improve farm management and add value to dairy products in Pakistan in particular for antibiotic use reduction, milk biosafety and state-of-the-art control on spreading of antibiotic resistance.

The visit provided an opportunity to the delegates to strengthen and/or create new business networks between Italian and Pakistani stakeholders involved in



dairy and livestock industry. The Vice-Chancellor also delivered a talk on "livestock sector of Pakistan' at a seminar titled "Livestock and Dairy Sector of Pakistan" at the Pakistan Embassy in Rome.

He said that FMD is a deadly disease which causes loss to the national economy. He said that it is our responsibility to adopt the latest international methods and technology



for the development of FMD vaccine cell suspension culture system to curb this deadly disease.

The aim of the workshop was to train local staff of the project in FMD vaccine production by using suspension culture system. Participants were trained on documentation, suspension cell culture system, virus culture, biological titration of FMD virus, inactivation, sterility/safety tests and formulation of vaccine, etc.
