International Buffalo Congress recommends technology-driven, commercial buffalo production





The University of Veterinary and Animal Sciences Lahore in collaboration with Livestock and Dairy Development Department Punjab organised International Buffalo Congress 2019 on February 18-19.

Punjab Chief Minister Sardar Usman Ahmed Khan Buzdar inaugurated the congress while Governor Punjab / Chancellor Ch Mohammad Sarwar chaired the concluding ceremony. The congress was aimed to review and update the work in the thematic areas of nutrition, reproduction, genetics, management, health, and socioeconomics of buffalo with its main theme "Subsistence to Commercialization".

The two-day Buffalo Congress recommended transformation of buffalo production from population driven to technology driven and from fragmented to more organized commercial model. "Transformation of subsistence to

CM inaugurates Sino-Pak Joint Research Centre for Buffalo

Punjab Chief Minister Sardar Usman Ahmed Khan Buzdar inaugurated Sino-Pak Joint Research Centre for Buffalo during the inaugural ceremony of the International Buffalo Congress on February 18. The centre will build a scientific platform for cooperative research and long-term development in the field of buffalo science between China and Pakistan. Another such research centre has been established at Guangxi Buffalo Research Institute Nanning, China. Last year Vice-Chancellor Meritorious Professor Dr Talat Naseer Pasha visited China and



signed an agreement with the Guangxi Buffalo Research Institute for the purpose. Other partners of the agreement from Pakistan are Cholistan University of Veterinary and Animal Sciences, Bahawalpur, COMSATS Institute of Information Technology, Sahiwal, Buffalo Research Institute, Pattoki, and Buffalo Breeders Association, Punjab.



Buffalo development contributes to achieving sustainable development goals: Prof Pasha

University of Veterinary and Animal Sciences Lahore Vice-Chancellor Prof Dr Talat Naseer Pasha has said that the International Buffalo Congress has been arranged to showcase remarkable achievements in buffalo science nationally and internationally.

He said that the information generated in the congress will help in bringing economic prosperity of buffalo farmers. Speaking about the importance of buffalo, Prof Pasha said that buffalo development will significantly contribute to achieving sustainable development goals of food security, nutrition, poverty alleviation, economic growth and employment. He said that despite buffalo's importance, institutional efforts, resource allocation, research and development are minimal; as a consequence its potential contribution has not been fully realized.

commercial farming needs input of technology packages combining breeding, feeding, disease control, management and marketing instead of piecemeal approach, so an integrated approach similar to the model of Swedish project in Sri Lanka be adopted," read the recommendations. It was further recommended adopting Fixed Time AI in smallholder buffalo farms and alternate non-conventional local feed resources be explored using R&D to make these safe for cost effective use in buffalo feeding.

The congress was spread over one plenary and 14 technical sessions and a farmer-industry forum, 12 business meetings, seven precongress workshops, 100 each posters and oral presentations on 10 different aspects of buffalo.

Effective steps taken to improve livestock: minister



Minister for Livestock and Dairy Development Punjab Sardar Hasnain Bahadar Dareshak has said that the government has taken effective steps to improve livestock in the province and to ensure availability of better quality meat and dairy products.

UVAS conference calls for formulating 'fisheries and aquaculture policy'



A two-day International Fisheries & Aquaculture Conference on "Emerging Trends for Sustainable Exploitation of Aquatic Resources" organised by the University of Veterinary and Animal Sciences has strongly recommended formulation of a 'fisheries and aquaculture policy' for the development of this emerging sector in the country.

The Department of Fisheries & Aquaculture in collaboration with UVAS-Industry Liaison Working Group, Punjab Fisheries Department and Pakistan Fishery Development Board arranged the conference and expo.

for betterment of an improvised human society. Buffalo farming is playing a pivotal role in the national economy by producing significant proportion of milk and meat and we have to develop it further, the governor said.
