CM inaugurates Veterinary Academy at UVAS



Punjab Chief Minister Sardar Usman Ahmed Khan Buzdar inaugurated a state-of-the-art Veterinary Academy at the University of Veterinary and Animal Sciences Lahore for the training and capacity building of veterinary professionals, faculty members and researchers.

enhancing livestock productivity. Presenting the welcome address, Vice-Chancellor Prof Dr Nasim Ahmad spoke about the academic, research and community services of the university. He said that UVAS is on the top among Pakstani universities in The Times Higher Education's impact ranking. He said that establishment of Biosafety Level 3 Laboratory is one of major achievements made by UVAS during the coronavirus pandemic. About the Veterinary Academy, the Vice-Chancellor said it is first of its kind of facility for the professional training of

faculty members and veterinary officers. "It is open to the industry related to poultry, dairy, meat, and pharmaceutical for trainings," Prof Nasim said.

Minister for Livestock Sardar Husnain Bahadur Dreshak said that Livestock Department has been formulating farmers-friendly policies for the betterment of poor farming community. He said that UVAS is working very closely with the dairy, livestock and poultry industries and the relevant industrialists have a strong liaison with this institution.

Secretary Livestock Saqib Zafar said that L&DD Department is equally

focusing on the training of its staff and professionals. He said Livestock Department Punjab is establishing disease free zones in south Punjab.

The CM also distributed sheilds among UVAS team members who have been involved in COVID-19 testing under the leadership of Prof Dr Tahir Yaqub, Director Institute of Microbiology. UVAS among world's top 1001+ universities in THE ranking

The University of Veterinary and Animal Sciences Lahore has been ranked among top 1001+ universities of the world by the Times Higher Education in its recent World University Rankings 2021.

This year's rankings by the Times Higher Education include more than 1,500 universities from 93 countries and regions, making them the largest and most diverse university rankings to date. The ranking analyzed more than 80 million citations from over 13 million research publications and included survey responses from 22,000 scholars globally.

Vice-Chancellor Prof Dr Nasim Ahmad congratulated the faculty members, staff and stakeholders on this great success and appreciated the efforts of Quality Enhancement Cell and contribution of faculty members and administration to quality education, research, community services and national development.

In the impact ranking 2020 of the Times Higher Education, UVAS is on the top among Pakistani universities in delivering the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). The UVAS stands at 101-200. Twenty-three Pakistan universities of public and private sector have featured in this ranking.

UVAS reopens in gradual manner

The University of Veterinary and Animal Sciences reopened all its campuses in a gradual manner under the guidelines of Punjab government and Higher Education Commission. Vice-Chancellor Prof Dr Nasim Ahmad approved three -phase mode of studies for students after reopening of the university. He stressed that SOPs should also be followed strictly to curb COVID-19. In the 1st phase, classes of 9th semester of five year and 7th semester four year degree program and 1st semester of all degree programs (undergraduate and postgraduate) resumed on September 21. In the 2nd phase, 7th Semester for five year degree program, 5th semester for 4 year degree program and 2nd semester of postgraduate degree program students ioined classes on October 5. In 3rd phase, 5th and 3rd semesters for five year degree programs and 3rd semester for four year degree programs classes will start from October 19.

UVAS reviews **CAPRIL** progress



The University of Veterinary and Animal Sciences at a meeting reviewed the progress made by the Center for Applied Policy Research in Livestock (CAPRIL) and proposed its future course of action. Vice-Chancellor Prof Dr Nasim Ahmad chaired the meeting while Chief of Party Punjab Enabling Environment Project (PEEP) Mr Andrew E Baker, UVAS faculty members and officials from the USAID-PEEP attended.

The Vice-Chancellor highlighted the role of UVAS in development of livestock sector. He said, "Since its establishment, the centre has taken many key initiatives to provide evidence-based information on emerging business trends and challenges to the relevant government departments and private sector players".

Prof Nasim also briefed Mr Andrew E Baker on UVAS history, campuses, labs. academic, research and development projects, national & international collaborations, industry linkages, ongoing projects, virtual training of officers, online telemedicine services. online teaching & exams during COVID-19, etc. He said UVAS has achieved a major breakthrough by confirming first pregnancy in Sahiwal cow through IVF. CAPRIL Director Prof Dr Rana Muhammad Ayyub spoke about the activities of the centre and linked those with the actual impact on relevant stakeholders, industry and livestock sector. Mr Andrew E. Baker acknowledged the role played by UVAS in general and CAPRIL in particular.

Induction workshop of Postgraduate Certificate in Higher Education Learning and Teaching



The induction workshop of Postgraduate Certificate in Higher Education Learning and Teaching (PG-HELT) was conducted in the Faculty of BioSciences, UVAS, Lahore. This was the first-ever postgraduate certification programme in South Asia for in-service veterinary, pharmacy and human nutrition educators. Nine faculty members were selected for this course.

The programme team, involving Dr Hafsa Zaneb, Dr Saima Ashraf and Dr Khalid Abdul Majeed, are alumni of Royal Veterinary College UK. Programme lead Dr. Hafsa Zaneb

welcomed the participants and introduced the course. The course primarily focuses on evidence-based approaches to student learning and teaching methods, reflective practice and student assessment and feedback. It will not only offer a professional development opportunity to the participants but also aims to modulate the quality of education being imparted. This aim is inspired from UVAS primary focus on training of competent veterinarians who will go on to lead the livestock sector which is an important segment of Pakistan's economy.
