The United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) Agriculture Counselor Mr Christopher Rittgers along with Senior Agriculture Specialist Asmat Raza from the US Embassy Islamabad visited the University of Veterinary and Animal Sciences and desired expanding their collaboration during a meeting with Vice-Chancellor Prof Dr Nasim Ahmed.

Vice-Chancellor University of Education Lahore Prof Dr Talat Naseer Pasha and representatives from the Pakistan Dairy Association Dr M Zubair, Prof Dr Aleem Bhatti, commercial dairy farmers, farm managers and stakeholders from public & private dairy industries, UVAS faculty members and deans were present.

Speaking on the occasion, Mr Christopher Rittgers said that primary objective of his visit was to expand their collaboration with UVAS especially in the areas of dairy herd management, food safety & food security,

animal nutrition, food processing, poultry and beef. He wanted to know about the success stories of UVAS Holstein Dairy Project, challenges of herd management, heat stress and training of faculty, farmers, students and farm managers.

Vice-Chancellor Prof Dr Nasim Ahmad gave an overview of UVAS research. development interventions, student strength and national and international collaborations. Prof Dr Talat Naseer Pasha shared his experiences as Project Director of the Dairy Training Research Farm project. Pro Vice-Chancellor Prof Dr Masood Rabbani said that UVAS has always been willing to collaborate with the USDA in the joint research projects for the development of dairy sector. Chairman Department of Theriogenology Prof Dr Amjad Riaz gave a presentation on embryology project and Dr Hifz-ul-Rehman on UVAS Holstein Dairy Project.

Lecture on 'Recent Trends in Veterinary Education'

The University of Veterinary and Animal Sciences (UVAS) Lahore arranged an awareness lecture on "Recent Trends in Teaching of Veterinary Education".

He spoke about new trends, modern research in veterinary education and use of scientific methods for the diagnoses of different diseases hampering the development of livestock sector of Pakistan. UVAS to establish Genomic Centre



The University of Veterinary and Animal Sciences Lahore will establish a Genomic Centre at the Department of Parasitology under a project funded by the Higher Education Commission Islamabad.

The project entitled "Tackling food security by controlling ticks and tickborne diseases in bovines" has been won by Prof Dr Muhammad Imran Rashid under the HEC scheme "Great Challenge Fund". The Board of Studies of Parasitology Department at a meeting discussed the project details and the establishment of the genomic centre. Vice-Chancellor Prof Dr Nasim Ahmad presided over the meeting while Pro Vice-Chancellor Prof Dr Masood Rabbani, Chairman Department of

Parasitology Prof Dr Kamran Ashraf were also present.

Prof Dr Imran Rashid said the genomic center being developed under this project will provide sequencing service to medical and veterinary sectors for solving the issue of ticks and tick-borne diseases, saving life of the cattle and ultimately securing food in shape of milk and meat. He said the project will be completed in three years at a cost of Rs. 152.3 million. The Vice-Chancellor lauded the efforts of the project team comprising Prof Dr M Imran Rashid (PI) and Prof Dr Kamran Ashraf and assured fulfilling all the project needs.

Earlier, Prof Kamran presented the vision of the department and introduced the project team.

The Department of Veterinary Medicine of UVAS organised an International Virtual Conference on Rabies Awareness and its Control.

More than 250 participants from five countries (Indonesia, the USA, Somalia, Kazakhstan and India)attended the conference. Vice-Chancellor Prof Dr Nasim Ahmad chaired the inaugural session of the conference while Pro Vice-Chancellor Prof Dr Masood Rabbani and Prof Dr Aneela Zameer Durrani also joined the meet. Speaking on the occasion, Prof Nasim urged the need for effective control measures against rabies in animals as well as in human population. Prof Aneela said that integrated management approaches are the need of the hour to overcome the barriers of control.
