The Institute of Biochemistry and Biotechnology, Department of Pathology and College of Veterinary Animal Sciences in collaboration with Pakistan Veterinary Medical Council (PVMC) arranged a three-day faculty development workshop on 'Knowing Cancer in Small Animals to Improve Their Quality of Life'.

Federal Joint Secretary Ministry of Interprovincial Coordination Mr Usman Sarosh and Vice-Chancellor Prof Dr Nasim Ahmad co-chaired the concluding session of the workshop and distributed certificates among participants and resource persons. UVAS Pro Vice-Chancellor/ PVMC President Prof Dr Masood Rabbani, President Pakistan Veterinary Medical Association Dr Muhammad Arshad, Prof Dr Asim Aslam, Prof Dr Waseem Shahzad were also present.

The training objectives were to impart better understanding of the latest trends in animal cancers to the training participants, to update them on the latest molecular and histopathological tools for cancer pathogenesis and also to promote the awareness and importance of animal cancers.

Induced breeding of Pangasius fish

The University of Veterinary & Animal Sciences and the Department of Fisheries Punjab jointly conducted successful induced breeding experiments on pangasius first time in public sector at Sindhuwan Fish Hatchery, Kasur. This is another great breakthrough in the history of Pakistani aquaculture industry after successfully developing and disseminating induced fish breeding technology of carps in 1960s and sex reversal technology of Tilapia in 2013.

The UVAS and Punjab Fisheries Department scientists worked on local as well as exotic commercially important and high value snakehead and catfish species and successfully developed protocols of induced breeding. This work has been done under two research projects won by Dean Faculty of Fisheries and Wildlife Prof Dr Noor Khan from HEC and PARB with the partnership of Punjab Fisheries Department.

Free treatment camp for sacrificial animals

The Department of Veterinary Medicine of UVAS in collaboration with a private pharmaceutical company and laboratory arranged a free treatment camp for sacrificial animals at the Outdoor Hospital. Pro Vice-Chancellor Prof Dr Masood Rabbani along with Chairperson Department of Veterinary Medicine Dr Jaweria Ali Khan inaugurated the free camp. Total 1,200 large and small animals were treated.
